## **Eunice Guild**

St. Paul says in 2 Tim. 1:5, that Eunice, the mother of Timothy, was a woman of "sincere faith." She loved her Lord and Savior, and she lived her faith. It is our prayer that we may all be granted this same sincere faith. God be with you and bless you as you spend time in Meditation and in Cooking With Eunice.

#### **Meditation** — "A Moment in Time"

If my husband, Bill, had not died very unexpectedly almost three years ago, we would celebrate our 47<sup>th</sup> anniversary this month. We were married in the unairconditioned Birkmann chapel on the old Concordia College The August weather that day was Texas hot with stifling humidity. (Probably not wise planning on our part!) We were young and had so many plans for long lives together. The future was big and bright, and nothing could stop us! Then one day, we shared a quick kiss goodbye, and he left to run a few errands only to never return. I went through the motions of making his funeral and burial arrangements, and then 44 years as my dear Bill's wife, ended in the blink of an eye. But wait! What about our retirement plans, our hopes and dreams? During these "pandemic" days, I've mostly just stayed home. I feared the days would drag by, but surprisingly, time has sped up! How is it possible that only a moment ago I shared smiles and hugs with my family of faith in the church's Narthex? And, I'm sure it's partly due to my weak self-discipline, but I have not even begun to go through the boxes of stuff in that last closet. This was to be the perfect opportunity for that! How fast time passes by, taking us with it! Where did yesterday go?!? Let me catch my breath! Well, Job knew this way back over 1,000 years before Jesus. He said, "Man born of woman is of few days and full of trouble. He springs up like a flower and withers away; like a fleeting shadow, he does not endure" (14:1, 2). Yep! I am just a moment in time. Bill and I chose congregational singing of the hymn "Let Us Ever Walk With Jesus" (LSB 685) for our wedding processional. The hymn was certainly foretelling with words such as: "a world that would deceive us," "today we sow no laughter," and "all discomforts that annoy." Life is indeed, as Job said, "full of trouble." The other day, a devotion I was reading led me to 2 Corinthians 4 where Paul says, "outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all" (16, 17). And then this, "So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal" (18). Bill and I loved to look to our future, and to plan and work toward our hopes and dreams. After he died, I was afraid to look past one day in my life. I chose to stay focused on what I could see, and that is where I filled my time. The author of the devotion I mentioned, called it being "nearsighted - consumed by the pain of this world." She said we should be "more farsighted - filled with hope in our loving God." Almost everything going on in our world today is inconceivable to me, and I am again often tempted to be near-sighted rather than far-sighted. I take my eyes off of the Savior and His cross. But my study Bible says that all of "the experiences in the present life are merely phenomena in the passing parade of our fallen age and are therefore fleeting." Yes. Life goes by in the blink of an eye, and I am barely a moment in time. But thanks be to God who in His great love, sees ALL, both near and far, and for whom my moment in time is precious! Jesus' life, death and resurrection, and the hope and glory of eternal life we know by faith in the Savior, are far greater and more powerful than anything! I can say with Paul, "therefore I do not lose heart" (2 Cor 4:16). I can forget "what is behind and . . . press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus! (Php 3:13, 14). With Joy in Christ! Duannah

### **Cooking With Eunice**

Hot Summer Afternoon Snacks

These yummy recipes are taken from JELL-O's "fun and fabulous recipes" book of 1988.

FROZEN CHOCOLATE GRAHAM CUPS (8 servings)

1 1/2 cups cold milk 1 pkg. (4-serving size) JELL-O chocolate flavor instant pudding 1 cup thawed Cool Whip 7 whole graham crackers, broken into pieces 1/2 cup miniature marshmallows 1/4 cup chopped salted peanuts

Pour cold milk into bowl. Add pudding mix. Whisk until well blended, 2 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes. Fold in Cool Whip, crackers, marshmallows and peanuts. Spoon into muffin pan lined with paper baking cups. Freeze until firm, about 3 hours. Garnish with additional Cool Whip, if desired.

For vanilla cups, substitute vanilla flavor instant pudding, and add slivered almonds and diced maraschino cherries, instead of marshmallows and peanuts.

EASY PUDDING MILK SHAKE (makes about 5 cups)

3 cups cold milk 1 pkg. (4-serving size) JELL-O instant pudding, any flavor 3 scoops (about 1 1/2 cups) ice cream, any flavor

Pour cold milk into blender. Add pudding mix and ice cream. Cover and blend at high speed for 15 seconds or until smooth. Enjoy at once. Mixture will thicken as it stands: thin with additional milk. if desired.

### **Guidelines for In-Person Worship at Christ**

We ask all those who plan to attend the worship service or discipleship class to:

- Avoid all handshaking, hugging, or touching of any kind with those outside their family.
- Bring a mask and wear it at all times within our facilities (except when receiving the Lord's Supper).
- † Maintain social distancing at all times while entering/ exiting/attending our worship and/or discipleship class.
- Please do not touch/handle/use any of the hymnals for any purpose (hymns/liturgies will be printed in the bulletin).
- † Please wash and/or sanitize your hands often while in attendance at Christ (i.e. entering the sanctuary, prior to Holy Communion, leaving the sanctuary).
- † Please do not gather in the narthex, sanctuary, or hallways to talk before or after worship.
- Please wait for your row to be dismissed at the end of worship and proceed to exit the building (unless you are attending the discipleship study or using the restroom).
- Please do not attend worship if you have any signs of illness (i.e. elevated temperature, sore throat, coughing, body aches, etc).
- ⊕ Err on the side of caution be respectful of others' fears and precautions
- † Come prepared to praise and thank God for bringing us back together, and continue to ask God to protect us as we once again gather for worship.
