Meditation

Ah, February, when words such as cold, chili, cupid and chocolates, come to mind - the latter two having to do mostly with Valentine's Day, Feb. 14th. The Lutheran Service Book (our hymnal), on page xii lists Feb. 14th as a day to remember St. Valentine, Martyr. It instructs us to look to him, and other saints, as "examples by which we may imitate both their faith and their holy living according to our calling in life" - "as examples of those in whom the saving work of Jesus Christ has been made manifest to the glory of His holy name." St. Valentine of Rome was a priest who was beheaded on Feb. 14, 269, for converting many to Christianity and helping Christians, in a pagan Rome. He refused to denounce Christ and convert to paganism to save his life. He also secretly performed many marriages within the Christian church at a time when marriage was prohibited. He is said to have restored the sight of his jailer's blind daughter through prayer before his execution, and he left a note to her signed, "Your Valentine." Valentine's Day, the celebration of romantic love, began to evolve during the 14th Century, and poems expressing this love were written and shared. My sister surprised me the other day with half a bag of "Tiny Conversation Hearts." I remember exchanging little boxes of these as a child with other children on Valentine's Day. The candies had sentiments such as "TRUE LOVE", "HUG ME", and "BE MINE" printed on them. I gave no thought to these missives of "love" before popping their nondescript sweetness into my mouth. Today's messages have changed to reflect the times with "AWESOME", "WINK WINK", and "TEXT ME", and are accompanied by flavors such as wintergreen, orange, and banana. The bag of hearts made me think of an Advent devotion I had read. I looked back through the booklet and found it for Dec. 19th, titled, "A Christmas Letter". The four short paragraphs were based on John 1:1-14, and the author wrote, "We could say that the original Christmas love letter was Jesus, the Word made flesh." She concluded by calling Jesus, "God's love letter to us." My first thought was, "Oh, that's kind of neat," but, I then began to take exception as it seemed too simplistic. I now know that I made my mistake by not giving much thought to the Bible verses assigned for the daily reading. In thinking about Valentine's Day and the sharing of words of love, I read again the verses from John, paying particular attention to John 1:1, 14, 18: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." "The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us." "No one has ever seen God, but God the One and Only, who is at the Father's side, has made Him known." "The Word." It is through words that we reveal who we are - our thoughts and our intentions - to others. It is through God's precious Word that He fully and perfectly shows Himself to us, and John tells us that God's Word was and is eternally His "One and Only" Son, Jesus, Himself true God. I cannot grasp this, but by the Holy Spirit working faith in me through God's Word, I do so believe it. In 1 John 4:10, we find these beautiful words, "This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins." It is in Jesus that God reveals His unmotivated, unfailing "True Love." This must have been what St. Valentine knew and believed, what gave him the strength and courage to share with others the words of love found only in Christ our hope for salvation. Yes. I do think we can say that Jesus is "God's love letter to us," - a message of love eager to be shared with others. It is the sweetest love - a love given freely and in abundance by our Heavenly Father in His Son, Jesus, our Savior.

Oatmeal Raisin Bars

1 c flour 1 tsp vanilla 1/2 c sugar 1 egg, beaten 1/2 c brown sugar

1/2 c butter (melted & cooled) 2 c old fashioned oats 1/2 tsp baking soda

1/2 tsp cinnamon 1/4 tsp nutmeg

1/2 tsp salt 1 c raisins



Preheat oven to 350°. Grease an 8X8 inch baking pan & line with parchment. In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, sugars, baking soda, salt, cinnamon & nutmeg. In a small bowl, mix together the vanilla, egg, & butter. Stir this into the dry ingredients. Fold in the oats & raisins. Batter will be thick. Spread the batter into the prepared pan & bake for 25 - 30 minutes.

Remove from oven; allow to cool before cutting into bars.
