


## The People of Christ Sharing the Love of Christ

## Meditation

My husband Bill and I had a similar childhood in that neither of us could remember a day spent without a little dog running around the house. So, it was only natural that soon after we married, we found ourselves at the Austin Humane Society looking for a dog to adopt - a small dog, female, with white and brown short hair, and oh so sweet. After more than one visit to the "pound," we had two in mind and were walking back and forth between their runs to try to settle on one. In an enclosure between the two, there was a smallish dog, male, with black and gray kinky long hair. He seemed to lack any personality, choosing to remain at the back of his enclosure watching the people. After a while, he began to run to the front of his pen each time we passed by, shove one of his legs through the opening at the side of the gate, and wave it up and down frantically as if trying to get our attention. When we finally stopped to look at him, he pushed his nose through an opening in the chain linked gate so hard we thought his eyeballs would pop out! And he yelped loudly when the hairs on his nose got caught in the wires! He was homely with his mismatched body parts and wiry hair, and the card on the gate indicated he had been there awhile. As we stood there looking at him, he held his leg out as far as possible. I took his paw gently in my hand and said, "I think this guy really wants us." We laughed as we told the attendants that he wanted to fill out our adoption papers. Our 17 plus years together were all the sweeter knowing it was our dear puppy who first wanted us. During this Lenten season, the Holy Spirit has drawn me to an extraordinary prayer, one spoken by Jesus after His final supper with His disciples. Judas had left to complete his betrayal of the Lord, and Jesus was spending the final few hours in words of explanation, comfort and love for His closest disciples, those who would carry on His teachings and build His church. He ended with a prayer. I'm certain there is great and wonderful theology within this prayer, however, my simple faith, though powered by the Holy Spirit, so often struggles to understand our Lord's precious Word, and this prayer is no exception. Yet, it's easy to see that it is a profound statement of Jesus' love. In particular, there is a portion of one of Jesus' sentences I cannot escape. It is as a lovely tune which plays over and over in my mind. Read this and see what you think. "Father, I want those You have given me to be with me where I am," (John 17:24). Jesus spoke these words as a Son to His Father whom He knew wanted the very same. "Father. . . You are in me and I am in You," (John 17:21). He also spoke with the authority of God, who He was, and as such, one who knew His "want" would be realized. And Jesus did not pray that all believers - "those You have given me" would simply be "where I am," but He added, "with me!" Doesn't that absolutely make your heart jump with joy!?! Jesus really wants us! He was willing to do, and has done, whatever it takes to ensure we, as believers in Him as our Savior, have eternal life in and with Him. It is the measure of our God's immeasurable love for us. It is what God our Heavenly Father wants and has ensured through His Son. At our Baptism, He signed the adoption papers. YEAH!! We belong to Him! He is going to take us home! We are His forever!! Our Savior said, "For I did not come to judge the world, but to save it" (John 12:47), and, then He said, "It is finished!" (John 19:30).

## **Cooking With Eunice**

"Kitchen Sink" Carrot Cake

### **Ingredients:**

2 c Flour 1 c oil
2 tsp baking powder 1 tsp vanilla
1 1/2 tsp baking soda 2 c grated raw carrots
1 tsp salt 1—8oz. Can crushed
1 1/2 tsp cinnamon 1/4 tsp nutmeg 1/2 c raisins, plumped
4 eggs 2 oz flaked coconut
2 c sugar

Preheat oven to 350°. Grease and flour a 9x13in pan. In a small mixing bowl, sift together flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg. In a larger bowl, beat together eggs, sugar, oil and vanilla. Stir in the dry ingredients. Add the carrots, pineapple, raisins, pecans and coconut. Pour into the prepared pan, and back for 45—48 minutes. Remove from oven and cool. Top with your favorite cream cheese frosting. A canned cream cheese frosting is very good, or use the following homemade frosting recipe.

## **Cream Cheese Frosting**

1/2 c butter, room temperature8 oz. cream cheese, softened1 tsp vanilla1—1lb box powdered sugar

Combine frosting ingredients, beat until fluffy.






