THE "GUARANTEE"

Our Dad was a storyteller. Some of his stories were absolutely true, some were stretched a bit, and some were sheer foolishness, but he had a way of bringing them to life. More importantly, each one had a lesson to tell. We loved his stories which he continued to share until the day he died. Dad was in the Army Air Corps during the final years of WWII, stationed at Ardmore Army Airfield in Oklahoma. There, men with specialty training, were assembled into B-26 and B-17 aircraft combat crews to finish their training before being shipped to Europe. Dad was a Master Sergeant mechanic in a unit that maintained and repaired the planes. He especially loved the B-17 Flying Fortress. He spoke very little of those years, but he often told us how he took great care to be sure any plane he worked on, left the hangar ready to fly, all the way to Europe and beyond if necessary. He said that after he had released a plane, he knew it wouldn't be long until he heard, "Alright Sergeant, let's go!" He'd grab his flight gear and run to a waiting jeep, or peddle his bike as fast as he could, out to the tarmac. Up into the B-17 he'd swing himself and into the nose gunner's bubble where he loved to ride. By this point in the story, Dad was in full motion, and we could feel the shaking of the plane's engines roaring to life, the way the propellers began to turn, the banking of the wings in flight. We flew with him in his memories over the sprawling Arbuckle Mountains and rolling plains as the magnificent plane soared! "But Dad, why did you have to be in the plane?" "Well," he answered, "I was the pilots' guarantee. They figured if I knew I'd have to fly in their plane, I'd make sure it was prepared, and safe!" St. Paul told the Corinthians about another "guarantee," saying "Now it is God who . . . put His Spirit in our hearts as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come" (2 Cor. 1:21, 22). And he said, "He who has prepared us for this very thing is GOD; who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee. So we are always of good courage. We walk by faith, not by sight" (5:5-7). Greater than my Dad's B-17's, these beautiful verses make my heart soar! In my eyes, Dad was a great man, and I know, a great mechanic - but he was only a man. Yet, the pilots put their trust in the work he did. They did the job to which they were called - to serve and protect their country. They climbed into those planes with great courage and flew! My Heavenly Father and Creator, the One who says, "I am GOD, and there is no other!" (Is. 46:9), has prepared me for the job to which I have been called, that is to be His Child, and to glorify Him. In my Baptism, He placed in me the best Guarantee - His Holy Spirit. I trust the work He does through the gift of my faith in the work my Savior did! And, the Spirit's maintenance is powerful! I am "being renewed day by day" (2 Cor. 4:16)! I am prepared! In Christ, I can rise every morning, step out into the day, and "soar" with great courage no matter what may come! Every November 11th, we observe Veteran's Day, a day to honor all of those who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces. This November 11th, I will think of my Dad, the pilots' "guarantee," and give thanks to God for the gift of my Dad and all Veterans who serve to protect us and our freedoms. I will thank God for my Guarantee, His Holy Spirit, who gives and maintains my faith and sets me free to live this life with courage and to serve in love. And, I will praise Him for His Guarantee that He is present in my life every day, all the way and beyond, even to the eternal glory I will know with my Savior!

Cooking With Eunice

No-bake Pumpkin Cheesecake

Thank you to my sister, Yvette, for cutting this out of a magazine and sharing!

Ingredients:

1 package (11.1 oz) no bake cheesecake mix
1/3 cup butter, melted
2 Tbsp. sugar
3/4 cup milk
3/4 cup canned pumpkin
1 tsp ground cinnamon
1/4 tsp ground cloves
Whipped topping (like Cool Whip)
Additional cinnamon, optional

Directions:

- 1. Set aside filling mix packet from cheesecake. Combine the contents of the crust mix packet with butter and sugar. Press onto the bottom and up the sides of a 9-inch pie plate. Refrigerate for at least 10 minutes.
- 2. While crust chills, combine the contents of filling mix packet, milk, pumpkin, cinnamon, and cloves in a large bowl. Beat on medium speed for three minutes.
- Pour filling into the crust. Chill at least one hour. Top with whipped topping and sprinkle with cinnamon if desired.

Guidelines for In-Person Worship at Christ

We ask all those who plan to attend the worship service or discipleship class to:

- Avoid all handshaking, hugging, or touching of any kind with those outside their family.
- † Bring a mask and wear it at all times within our facilities (except when receiving the Lord's Supper).
- † Maintain social distancing at all times while entering/ exiting/attending our worship and/or discipleship class.
- † Please do not touch/handle/use any of the hymnals for any purpose (hymns/liturgies will be printed in the bulletin).
- † Please wash and/or sanitize your hands often while in attendance at Christ (i.e. entering the sanctuary, prior to Holy Communion, leaving the sanctuary).
- † Please do not gather in the narthex, sanctuary, or hallways to talk before or after worship.
- Please wait for your row to be dismissed at the end of worship and proceed to exit the building (unless you are attending the discipleship study or using the restroom).
- Please do not attend worship if you have any signs of illness (i.e. elevated temperature, sore throat, coughing, body aches, etc).
- † Err on the side of caution be respectful of others' fears and precautions
- The Come prepared to praise and thank God for bringing us back together, and continue to ask God to protect us as we once again gather for worship.
