Meditation —

"HE KNOWS"

A sweet friend said something several months back that still occupies my thoughts. It was only two words, and although I feel I understand their significance, maybe I really don't? The words were spoken after I mentioned that with all the troubles and heartbreak in the world, in the church, in our families and our own lives, I sometimes feel I no longer know what to pray for. She wisely responded, "He knows." I keep thinking about those two words, "He knows." Well, of course He knows. By faith, we know God knows all things past, present and future! But, doesn't your sinful nature sometimes tap you on the shoulder and ask, "Yes, but does He understand, really, how you feel?" Do you ever think it may be better if you could just "explain" it to God? Maybe be really sure He knows what you want? Several weeks ago, my brother and I sat mesmerized as we watched on real-time television, severe weather events taking place all around us. Cameras seemed to be everywhere capturing rotating clouds teasing threats of becoming a tornado. The weather forecasters were sadly almost comical as they tried to keep up with it all. Suddenly, a camera showed a funnel quickly form, cross a busy highway and begin its path of horrifying destruction! The weather news people were all talking at once when one exclaimed that a tornado warning hadn't even been issued! You could hear his unbelief that their advanced weather technology could not detect any rotation in time to warn the public! They did not know! "But," I thought, "God knew." So often, my evening prayers are little more than miserable ramblings late into the night as I try to make sure God knows - whatever. I know better, but as a child of God AND a sinner, well, I am often conflicted and anxious in prayer. In Psalm 139 (a favorite!), David sings a very personal and intimate prayer to God: "O Lord, you have searched me and you know me . . . when I sit and when I rise . . . my going out and my lying down. Before a word is on my tongue you know it completely. All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be." He beautifully rambles on and on telling God things He, of course, knows, and he acknowledges that God is fully involved in his life - knew how he was formed, his actions, thoughts, future - that "God knows!" Then David says, "Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me . . .". I've never given these last two verses much thought, but it seems David, too, was anxious in prayer. His solution? First, he asked God into his heart and thoughts to find the source of his anxiety - his sins. Then, he ended his psalm with, "and lead me in the way everlasting." David told God in prayer the things he knew God knows, asked Him to search out his sins, and finally to lead him to the source of peace - His Salvation. Then he was silent. As I anxiously ramble in my most intimate prayers telling God what He already knows, acknowledge His presence, and ask forgiveness, I always feel a peace come over me before I'm even finished. It is then I find myself falling into the Heavenly Father's open arms, and I go silent. It is then the Savior leads me to know the impact of His presence, His unfailing love and compassion, not only in my life, but in ALL things. It is then He leads me to know His Holy Spirit's power to make my prayers right before God. It is then I know true peace in His death and resurrection for the forgiveness of my sins - His Salvation! Those brief moments in the night before I close my eyes to sleep, yes peacefully, are truly the most wonderful moments of my life! You see, it is then that the Savior tells me, "I know!" Our Pasta Carbonara

Such a quick and easy recipe! One of our favs! Perfect for a summer evening. For a complete meal, we add veggies and quick meats.

8 oz spaghetti (broken in half)

2 - 4 slices bacon, large dice

1 cup Spam (diced), and/or frozen meatballs (thawed slightly & halved)

2 large garlic cloves, minced

1/2 cup onion, diced

1/2 cup bell pepper, small dice

1/2 cup frozen green peas, room temp

2 large eggs, well-beaten

1 cup freshly grated Parmesan, divided

1/2 tsp black pepper

Red pepper flakes (to taste)

Salt (to taste according to saltiness of meat)

Cook pasta according to directions. Drain but reserve at least 1/2 cup of the cooking liquid and set aside. While pasta is cooking, brown bacon over medium high heat in a large skillet until crisp. Remove bacon with a slotted spoon and set aside. Add the Spam and/or meatballs to the skillet and lightly brown. Add veggies to the skillet and cook until tender, adding 1 Tbsp. butter if needed. While veggies cook, mix together in a small bowl the eggs, about 3/4 cup Parmesan, black pepper and red pepper flakes, and set aside. When veggies are tender, add the drained pasta and mix well. Remove the skillet from the heat, and quickly stir in the egg mixture, tossing quickly to prevent scrambling. Be sure all of the ingredients are coated with the luscious egg/Parmesan sauce. Add reserved pasta water, a little at a time, if the sauce is too dry. Taste and add any needed salt. Plate and top with the remaining Parmesan.
