
Dear friends,

"I will meditate on Your wonderful works. Great is the Lord and most worthy of praise!" *Psalm 145:5, 3*

"A Valentine Message"

"For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him." These beautiful words from the Gospel of John (3:16, 17), came to mind as I thought about the observance of both Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday this year, 2024, on February 14th. As a child in parochial school, I remember cutting hearts from red construction paper, pasting them to a brown paper lunch bag, and using a few crayons to decorate it and print my name. Our teacher then tacked each child's decorated bag to the cork wallboard. On Valentine's Day, we all arrived with a handful of valentine cards from the dime store, on which we had printed our name next to preprinted words of friendship. We dropped one into each of the bags on the wall, and then waited anxiously for the afternoon party when we received our little bags to sort through and read the pretty cards inside. Fun! After a few days, they were forgotten, and Mom tossed them out. St. Valentine was a 3rd century evangelist in the Roman Empire. When he refused to renounce his faith and cease his work in telling others of Christ, he was condemned to death. Just before his execution, he is said to have written a note to his friend, the blind daughter of his jailor, both of whom had been brought to faith and baptized. The note was signed, "from your Valentine," inspiring the tradition of sharing messages of love on Valentine's Day. It's a nice tradition, and I still enjoy sending a few valentine cards as a reminder of my love, or by gifting flowers or candy. But eventually, candy is eaten, flowers wither, and cards are tossed. However, there is a message of LOVE that is everlasting, the one shared by St. Valentine. It's the most wonderful "Valentine message" ever! "For God so loved the world that He gave his one and only Son!" If ever I need to be reminded that I am loved with a LOVE freely given to me by faith, with no conditions, no terms, eternal - I open my Bible, God's message of LOVE, and I read, and listen. "The Lord is . . . loving toward all He has made" (Ps 145:13). "My unfailing LOVE for you will not be shaken" (Is 54:10). "This is how God showed His LOVE among us: He sent His one and only Son into the world that we might live through Him" (1 Jn 4:9). "How great is the LOVE the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!" (1 Jn 3:1). "We have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Ro 5:1). "Come to me... and I will give you rest" (Mt 11:28). "I am with you always" (Mt 28:20). And on and on. But the one I turn to most often and say with St. Paul: "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, ... nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate [me] from the LOVE of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Ro. 8:38, 39). When a little girl, the messages on my valentine cards did not mean much, and were soon forgotten, but what I do remember well, is happily singing, "Jesus loves me, this I know; for the Bible tells me so!" Little did I know then how much I would come to cling to that truth! Ash Wednesday, which begins Lent, and Valentine's Day are the same day this year. I'll observe it by reading in my Bible, God's messages of LOVE, the LOVE that is Jesus. And then, I'll bow my head to reflect on and repent of my sins with all confidence in the forgiveness I know in Him, Christ, my Savior! "Yes, Jesus Loves me. The Bible tells me so!"

In a time of less volunteerism due to Covid-19 and such, the online giving is less cumbersome and more streamlined for our Financial Secretary to manage. We are charged a 2.75% transaction fee whenever a credit/debit card is used, and while that may not seem like a lot for a \$25 offering (\$0.69 fee), for a \$500 offering (\$13.75 fee) those fees become quite significant. Again, we are grateful for any and all offerings and gifts to Christ Lutheran, but in order to be the best stewards of what God has entrusted to us we do kindly ask all of you credit debit card givers to consider using one of your bank accounts instead. Thank you.
