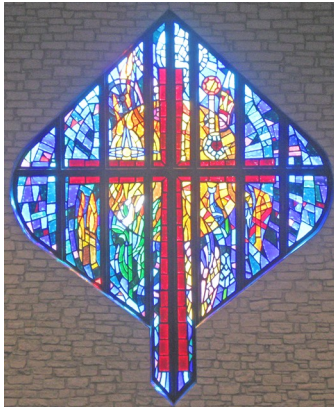

The following list are staple foods that Bread for All includes in all food bags. 1 lb. Rice (any kind); 1 lb. dry beans or lentils (any kind); canned beans, veggies, fruit; canned soup; pasta; oatmeal (small cans or packages or even single serve assortments). FEET

I saw a foot doctor the other day. It was not unpleasant although my ego took a little beating. My feet, especially the left one, are not pretty. They were normal looking, but now, my severely damaged spinal cord’s effects on nerves and muscles, are making my legs and left foot look, well, weird. It’s no big deal as I wear heavy-duty compression stockings and shoes every day, and my feet stay hidden. Well, that day, a nice young Tech helped remove my shoes and stockings, and then lifted my legs onto an exam chair. As I sat there a bit slumped and uncomfortable, I thought, or imagined, I saw him grimace slightly when he glanced down at my swollen, cracked, and discolored feet and legs. I wanted to explain how a sick spinal cord can cause a lot of things to go wrong, but the doctor walked in. My therapist and my primary doctor had advised me to see a podiatrist for “excessive supination” which can cause a fall. Weakness and shifting along my spine cause me to walk on the outside edge of my left foot which has thrown off all my alignment. Plus, it hurts! In sin, I was feeling a bit embarrassed and sorry for myself, but a Bible verse came to mind. I couldn’t remember fully – just something in Isaiah about “beautiful feet”? So, I looked it up that night. O yes, the wonderful, comforting words in Isaiah 52:7-12+. “How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news!” (vs 7). Isaiah prophesied of messengers coming to announce good news to God’s people when captive in Babylon: They will proclaim, “Your God reigns!” and everyone will shout and sing for joy. The Lord cares about His people and will redeem Israel. He will show His great might and reign over all people! With God Himself to lead and guard them, they will return home peacefully and safely to freedom, to serve the Lord! Isaiah did not write about the physical beauty of the messengers’ feet but rather the beauty of what they did. They carried the messengers who brought the good news! St. Paul liked verse 7 also. In his letter to the Romans he wrote, “How can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, ‘How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!’” (Rom. 10). He wrote of preachers, our Christian preachers, those authorized and sent to proclaim the Gospel. God speaks through them! Well, I don’t believe I’ve ever seen my Pastor’s, or any pastor’s, bare feet, but I know they are indeed “beautiful!” That’s because those feet carry them each Sunday morning from the comfort of their home to a church, as they make preparations, as they rise from prayer and step into a pulpit, all to tell me the GOOD NEWS that in Christ I am saved! And it is GOOD NEWS because, they remind me, I am a sinner deserving of eternal death, but Jesus died on a cross as punishment for my sins and rose from the grave in victory over that death that I may live with Him forever! But as I thought about this, I realized that just as it takes a healthy spinal cord to provide the necessary stimuli to move feet, it takes something more to move the feet of those who proclaim the Gospel. It takes special “stimuli,” something from the heart, a gift from God. It takes an abiding faith in, and love for, the one true Savior, Christ our Lord. And it’s not only pastors’ feet that are beautiful, but the feet of all those who share the GOOD NEWS, the LOVE of God manifest in Christ. Even my crooked, swollen feet are beautiful when they take me where God wills, to say to someone - or write - “Jesus loves you.” As our Lord helped and guided the Israelites, He will help and guide us when called to share the GOOD NEWS. With confidence in Him, may we always do so joyfully! *in Christ, Duannah*

MOM’S MOCK SLAW

1 can sauerkraut, drain (& rinse, optional)
 1 cup celery, diagonal slices
 2/3 cup green bell pepper, thin strips
 1/2 cup diced onion
 1/4 cup sugar
