Meditation —

"SO GREAT!"

Our large West-facing window has old shades which are pulled to fully open almost every day. The Spring view is across a tree studded yard sprinkled with wild flowers and a patch of rustled cacti, through a barbed-wire fence, over a one-lane road, and into dense woods. No matter the weather, it's a view kissed by God. We can tell the month of the year by simply watching the sunsets. In December, the sun sets just past the large mountain laurel and over the prairied ridge toward the southwest. As days pass, the sunset moves up the road - behind Mom's red rose bush, then the Ash tree and the trunk of the large Live Oak. For a while, it moves across the yard, shielded by the woods but occasionally breaking through to brightly blind us for a few moments as we watch television. During May, it once again peeks in and out of our trees, and by mid-June it will be at our gate and ready to begin its trek back down the road to the large mountain laurel. I take comfort in knowing this sun that rises every day to provide for life on earth, will mark time across our yard and set without fail. So Great is our God! The night of May 15th, my brother and I were blessed to watch a most spectacular total lunar eclipse in a jaw-dropping starlit sky! We never tire of God's awesome wonders! I am reminded of a loved gospel hymn's text of praise, "How Great Thou Art," by Swedish pastor, Rev. Carl Boberg: "O Lord my God, when I in awesome wonder consider all the worlds Thy hands have made . . . Thy power throughout the universe displayed!" Absolutely! "How Great!" does not begin to describe our God! King David knew this, singing: "His greatness no one can fathom" (Ps 145:3), "He determines the number of stars and calls them each by name" (Ps. 147:4). WOW! I get so excited thinking of our Great God the Creator and His Love for us, and I am at peace. St. Paul wrote, "For by [Christ] all things were created; things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible . . . all things were created by Him and for Him" (Col. 1:16). Christ is our Creator - He speaks to us - but how can we hear Him with all the "noise" in our lives? My sister told me of a devotion she read with a story about a boy and a watch. A worker in an icehouse lost his watch there. He and his co-workers searched for it without success, and gave up. A boy who had been watching, went in for a few minutes and then came out with the watch. He told them, "I just kept quiet until I heard its ticking and followed it." We can take a lesson from this boy. We have nothing to search for as God is always with us, but we must put aside our scheduled busyness and be still to hear God's voice. When we do, we will hear Him - in every worship service, whenever we read His Word, even in our prayers if we only pause for a moment before our "Amen," to listen. So, grab your Bible and go sit outside or by a window with open shades, read Psalms 145 - 147 (or your favorites), listen, and hear. Quietly look upon and consider the loving work that is the Savior's Creation - the shade of a tree, falling rain, the setting sun. Let His Word soak in and follow it to His Greatness! Know that He loves you and cares for you. The immeasurable LOVE that is the Savior, who through His death and resurrection claimed us for His own, is our only true source of peace. His promise of life everlasting with Him is so much greater and more certain than the rising and setting of the sun. David said, "The Lord is faithful to all His promises and loving toward all He has made. Let every creature praise His holy Name forever and ever" (Ps 145:13, 21)! In Christ. Duannah

Summer Squash Casserole

This recipe is sure to please, a delicious way to prepare those extra yellow squashes you have growing in your garden or those you could not resist buying at the farmer's market. It's one of those dishes you simply cannot stop eating!

6 cups cubed yellow squash (about 6 or 7 medium squash)

1/4 cup onion, chopped

2 eggs, beaten

3/4 cup bread or cracker crumbs (divided)

1/4 cup butter, melted

1/4 cup sugar

1 tsp salt

1/2 tsp pepper

Preheat oven to 350°. Cut squash in half lengthwise. Scrape out larger seeds with a spoon and discard. Cube squash and boil in salted water for 5 minutes. Drain for 10 minutes. Sauté onion in a little butter until translucent. Put drained squash in a mixing bowl and mash with a potato masher. Add onions, eggs, 1/2 cup crumbs, melted butter, sugar, salt and pepper. Mix well. Place in a greased 1 1/2 qt. casserole dish. Sprinkle remaining 1/4 cup crumbs on top. Cover and bake for 20 minutes. Uncover and bake an additional 10 minutes.

Online Giving -- A word of thanks to all of you for your continued support of our ministry here at Christ Lutheran Church, and a special note of thanks to all of you who have chosen to give online through our website with the Vanco portal. In a time of less volunteerism due to Covid-19 and such, the online giving is less cumbersome and more streamlined for our Financial Secretary to manage.
