Meditation —

"My Dusty Old Bug-eaten Book" - I had no topic ideas for the July Newsletter's Meditation. What was relevant? Where should I search in God's Word? I sat with my two favorite Bibles and prayed for guidance. But I felt nothing. Maybe walking around a bit would help. I got up, and as I walked past my bookcase, I saw two books not aligned to my liking. I tried straightening them to no avail and then pulled out a small book that was shoved between them. It was a mess - old, sun faded on one corner, dusty, and yuck! - munched on by some bug! The title was, "Teenager, Christ's Love Will Make You Live." Where did I ever get that book? O sure. I remembered when I flipped the cover open and read the inscription in my uncle's very distinctive back-slanting left-handed print, "To Duannah on Your Confirmation Day March 19, 1967 From Merty and Uncle Prof," (my grandmother and uncle). From Concordia Publishing House, copyright 1962, Walter Riess author, it comprises 22 very short lessons concerning teenage issues and Christian faith, and 11 "Prayers to Help You Live." I didn't recall ever reading the book, but two lessons had been dog-eared by someone. Well, being age 68, a few years have passed since I had teenage issues, but I decided to read the dog-eared lessons beginning with "Those Inner Feelings Are Saying Something." The author told teenaged me that my "feelings run up and down inside [of me].. bobbing like a raft on an ocean." I remembered that, and before I finished the lesson's two pages, I was moved to tears. He wrote it's "one reason we need our church the way lungs need air." "Even when we're old," I whispered. He said we need to "connect our inner spiritual life with a place, a group of people – a home." We see Christ's Love in the "real, touchable crucifix." We see the history of Christ's "people and their praises to Him," in the pages of our hymnal. For "visible, touchable evidence" of God's Love, we should "touch the bread and taste the wine that carries into your very body His own body and blood," and at "the baptismal font, remember how you carry that Baptism with you every single day of your life." The author wrote that we see God Himself "in the realness of cross and font and Communion cup – and in the miracle of the Word of God moving through pulpit and sacraments into your flesh and blood." Beautiful statements of reasons to "go to church," but within the lesson, an even more profound message emerged as a much-loved Bible verse came to mind. "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Heb. 13:8)! This lesson, written 60-plus years ago, remains relevant. It has not changed, because the Savior has not changed. It does seem as if right now more than any time in my life, God's Word is under relentless attack. But I take heart. No matter what Satan tries to do in and through this sinful world, there are absolutely NO ifs, ands, or buts about Christ, NO compromises to God's Word! Isaiah said, "the Word of our God stands forever" (Isa. 40:8). It stands with nothing added or taken away, because The Word is Jesus, the Christ. He remains steadfast and faithful to His promises of Unfailing Love and Life everlasting with Him! God said, "Even to your old age and gray hairs, <u>I am He</u> who will sustain you" (Isa. 46:4). Who would have thought an old, bug-eaten book for teenagers, would become a Meditation topic - and hold a needed message of hope for an old, gray-headed woman? I will read more! And the book has endured - yes, it's on Amazon. I would think it has perhaps been updated to include current teenager issues, and I certainly pray the author is true to God's Word. But this I know for certain: Christ has always been true to me, and no matter what, He will always remain true to ALL believers! In Christ, Duannah

Pete's Red Water

This is a family favorite, featured at many get-togethers! It's a quick and easy crowd pleaser and goes with everything from a summer bar-b-que to a Thanksgiving feast! Many heartfelt "Thank You's" to our Pete for sharing his famous Red Water recipe!

5-gallon thermos/cooler 1 bag of ice (10 lbs.)

 $3 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$ gallons water

6 pkgs. Kool-Aid, assorted flavors (use a mix of Tropical Punch, strawberry, orange, lemon, lemon/lime,

etc. HOWEVER, DO NOT use grape or cherry!)

White granulated sugar (5 lb. bag)

1 can pineapple juice (46 oz.)

Pour 1/2 bag of ice into cooler. Fill cooler to about 2/3 full with water (about 3 gallons). With a big spoon, stir in the 6 packages of assorted Kool-Aid flavors and the sugar until all dissolved. Stir in the can of pineapple juice. Just before serving, add the other 1/2 bag of ice. SO GOOD!!!

Online Giving -- A word of thanks to all of you for your continued support of our ministry here at Christ Lutheran Church, and a special note of thanks to all of you who have chosen to give online through our website with the Vanco portal. In a time of less volunteerism due to Covid-19 and such, the online giving is less cumbersome and more streamlined for our Financial Secretary to manage. That being said, we would ask those of you giving through this online way to consider giving through your bank accounts (savings or checking) as opposed to using a credit/debit card. We are charged a 2.75% transaction fee whenever a credit/debit card is used, and while that may not seem like a lot for a \$25 offering (\$0.69 fee), for a \$500 offering (\$13.75 fee) those fees become quite significant. Again, we are grateful for any and all offerings and gifts to Christ Lutheran, but in order to be the best stewards of what God has entrusted to us we do kindly ask all of you credit debit card givers to consider using one of your bank accounts instead.
