Meditation —

"Sincere Faith"

A small dot of blue-red light flashed across my work papers. "Huh?" I wondered, but didn't really care, "probably sunlight bouncing off a passing car." But then, another dot, and another, and another. My curiosity was piqued. I looked out the window and around the room, hunting for what could grab the sunlight and make such a show! By now, beautiful sparkling multi-colored dots were dancing all around and on me! It was magical! I giggled out loud as I looked up and found the source of my delight! There it was - the funny, overly glittered cardboard space shuttle, dangling from the center of an over-sized mobile, turning slowly in the quiet breeze of my ceiling fan. I giggled again. My husband, Bill, enjoyed making unique themed centerpieces for our church's annual Eunice Guild Spring Luncheons. Made of old cardboard boxes, they were large, colorful, and a bit comical as they moved in the slightest breeze. All of this "luncheon artwork" still hangs in my little room. The mobile I watched that day has twelve cardboard stars surrounding a purple space shuttle with red and yellow flames shooting out the back – and tons of glitter! Glued onto the sides of the shuttle are 21 rounded pictures of ladies' faces copied from church directories. I watched the dearly familiar smiling faces slowly dancing around, carrying me back to blessed gatherings. The Eunice Guild ladies no longer meet as some have moved away or now rest in Jesus' arms, or for other reasons, but this writing is not about loss. Nope, it's about growth! You see, in 1947, seven ladies of our church began a women's organization they called the Eunice Guild, and what a wise name choice they made! Eunice, and her mother, Lois, were Jewish women who believed in God, and Eunice and her Greek husband, who was not a believer, had a son, Timothy. St. Paul wrote in his second letter to Timothy, "I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, dwells in you as well" (2 Tim. 1:5). "Continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus" (2 Tim. 3:14-15). From infancy, Timothy was taught by Eunice and Lois about God and a Savior. Paul taught him even more about his Savior, Christ Jesus. As Timothy grew and matured, he watched these three people he loved go about their daily lives, and he learned what it means to have sincere faith. He witnessed what living in forgiveness looks like - the freeing peace, joy, contentment and hope it gives. Paul saw this sincere faith in Timothy. He knew that Timothy would follow him well in spreading the Gospel. As Christians, we learn God's Word from parents, Sunday School teachers, pastors, etc. When we interact with other Christians, we learn about sincere faith - about living our faith! When I joined the Eunice Guild, I gained more from the experience than I could have ever imagined. I listened to the ladies' laughter, to their conversations, and as they read God's Word. I saw their smiles and tears, their heads bowed in prayer, and felt their hugs. I watched them place their Mission Mites, stamps, offerings and snacks on a shared table, and heard their reports about service projects. My faith grew and evolved by simply being with the women of those smiling faces in the glittered space shuttle - by witnessing their sincere faith. (You know who you are, and I am forever grateful to you!) When Christians are together, God speaks to us through each other. His whispers teach us how to live in Christ's forgiveness and love. How precious is God's gift to be able to be with other believers in Christ! I pray I may always, like Eunice and our Guild ladies, be an example of *sincere faith* even as I continue to learn, and to grow. In Christ, Duannah.


Egg Salad Tortilla Wrap

This recipe idea is from a credit union, and a perfect summer meal.

2 Hard-boiled eggs, peeled and chopped Green onion, chopped Jalapeno, chopped (optional) Mayonnaise Mustard Salt and pepper Tortilla Provolone cheese (sandwich slices) Lettuce Avocado

Combine eggs, green onion, and jalapeno. Stir in mayonnaise and mustard. Add salt and pepper. Set aside. Lay a tortilla flat and cover with cheese slices. Add a lettuce leaf. Spread egg salad onto lettuce. Top with avocado slices. Loosely fold or roll up and enjoy with fresh fruit.

Online Giving -- A word of thanks to all of you for your continued support of our ministry here at Christ Lutheran Church, and a special note of thanks to all of you who have chosen to give online through our website with the Vanco portal. In a time of less volunteerism due to Covid-19 and such, the online giving is less cumbersome and more streamlined for our Financial Secretary to manage. That being said, we would ask those of you giving through this online way to consider giving through your bank accounts (savings or checking) as opposed to using a credit/debit card. We are charged a 2.75% transaction fee whenever a credit/debit card is used, and while that may not seem like a lot for a \$25 offering (\$0.69 fee), for a \$500 offering (\$13.75 fee) those fees become quite significant. Again, we are grateful for any and all offerings and gifts to Christ Lutheran, but in order to be the best stewards of what God has entrusted to us we do kindly ask all of you credit debit card givers to consider using one of your bank accounts instead. Thank you.
