#### Meditation —

#### "OUR PASTORS – OUR SHEPHERDS"

What is a "pastor"? Easy answer - he's the guy in the pulpit each Sunday! With all the pastors there have been in my life, a more definitive definition should come easily to mind from memories. Let's see. My uncle, an LCMS pastor, bounced up and down, loudly singing "From Greenland's Icy Mountains" as he tried to teach a very young me on our home organ, how to lead congregational singing. There was Pastor Studtmann who baptized me, but I was only one month old. Pastor Wickham of our church, who baptized my sister and brother, but, still too young for memories. Jesse at St. Paul who taught and confirmed me. I remember him with awe and love - and a bit of fear which was probably a good thing for me. Bohrer, of our church, who patiently allowed 17-year-old me to become an organist, taught Lutheran confessions to and confirmed my fiancé, Bill, and then performed our marriage. Linderman, who taught me the value of contemporary worship. A whole host of vacancy and associate pastors, vicars, and retired pastors who together, mostly taught me that pastors are not formed from the same cookie cutter. And of course, our Pastor John, who buried our parents and my husband, and whose principled teaching is a work in process for me. No definition yet, but the word "teach" stands out. My NIV Bible uses the word "pastor" only once. In Ephesians 4:11, Paul wrote, "It was He who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers". I don't think it's by accident that "pastors and teachers" is written as one entity. Pastors must be, and are teachers, because Paul added in his definition, "to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up (Eph. 4:12). Or, from my ESV Bible: "to equip the saints for the work of ministry." WOW! We have a job to do, and with God's help, our pastors must prepare us for it. But there's more. In the ESV Bible, the word "shepherds" is used instead of "pastors." Paul told the pastors of Ephesus to "Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock", and to "Be shepherds of the church of God" (Acts 20:28-29). Jesus, as the Good Shepherd, taught His disciples with compassion and understanding, preparing them for their work of ministry, and so are our pastors to shepherd us. But we must remember, pastors don't have the power of angels, and they aren't angels. They are human sinful men with needs: food, clothes, sleep, time to study, time to relax, families and friends, encouragement and support – just like me. I've seen their impatience, rudeness, and anger, their disappointment and despair – just like me. I've witnessed when emotions led them to say or do something regrettable – just like me. Knowing all of this, well, I may too often have unrealistic expectations of them, and I've come to the conclusion that pastors aren't just the guy in the pulpit. With God's help, they must strive to lead us along the path of salvation as our patient teachers, understanding counselors, and compassionate comforters. They are God's voice and hands as they baptize, confirm, marry, and bury us. They pray for us, and bring Christ to us in the bread and wine, and in His Word. AND, I am not just a person in a pew! I must somehow be present and do my God-given job of serving others and sharing Christ. I must treat my pastor, as well as all members of our church, with heartfelt patience, understanding, and compassion, always loving and praying for them. By the way, this is our pastor's personal mission statement: "My purpose is to glorify God by challenging and instructing others to help them grow toward their fullest God-given potential." This October, Pastor Appreciation Month, I will remember our pastors as God's precious blessings, thank Him and ask Him to bless them all, and especially mine, Pastor John. Thank you, Pastor, for all you do – always to the glory of God. In Christ, Duannah.

#### Pasta Fagioli

An easy, hearty fall soup.

- 1 lb. lean ground beef
- 1 slice bacon, diced
- 1 Tbsp. olive oil
- 2 medium carrots, grated or small dice
- 2 stalks celery, small dice
- ½ medium onion, diced
- 3 garlic cloves (1 Tbsp.) minced garlic
- 1 can (14.5 oz) crushed or petite diced tomatoes
- 1 can (15 oz) red kidney beans, drained
- 1 can (15 oz) Great Northern beans, drained
- 2 cans (14.5 oz) chicken broth (low-sodium)
- 1 jar (24 oz) spaghetti sauce
- 1 tsp. black pepper
- 1 tsp. Italian seasoning
- ½ tsp. red pepper flakes
- 8 oz (1 cup) ditalini pasta, or small elbow macaroni


Freshly grated parmesan cheese, fresh chopped parsley

In skillet, brown ground beef, drain and put into a crock pot. In same skillet, cook bacon in olive oil until crisp. Remove bacon and add to crock pot. In same skillet, cook carrots, celery, onion and garlic until beginning to soften. Add to crock pot along with tomatoes, beans, broth, spaghetti sauce, and seasonings. Cook on low 4-5 hours. About 20 minutes before ready to serve, cook pasta, drain, and stir into soup. If too thick, add some pasta water to crock pot. Allow to cook an additional 10 minutes. Adjust seasonings. Top bowls of soup with parmesan and/or parsley if desired.

In a time of less volunteerism due to Covid-19 and such, the online giving is less cumbersome and more streamlined for our Financial Secretary to manage.
