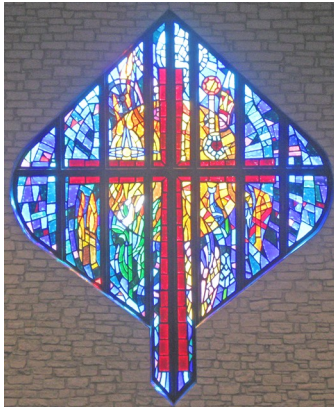

Letter from the President



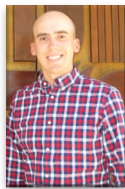
Mission Statement

Meditation —

"LETTERS"

"Grace and peace to you." In elementary school, a teacher gave to me the name and address of a girl in Germany who wanted an American pen pal. I don't recall why, maybe a school project, or extra credit? But I do remember feeling excited and a bit apprehensive. We were told to begin by writing a letter of just a few sentences about ourselves, which I did, and then it was mailed for me. I was so excited the day an envelope with the most beautiful stamps, all the way from Germany, appeared in our mailbox! Someone had written a letter and mailed it - to me! I was hooked. I love writing letters, but even more, I love receiving letters from others telling me about their days, their surroundings, their successes and disappointments, their thoughts and hopes, their likes and loves. Letters are personal and intimate, and can be kept to be reread. Just knowing someone took the time to write a letter touches my heart in a special way. My life has been richly blessed to have had several dear relatives and friends who share a love of letter writing. Perhaps this is why I am drawn to the letters of St. Paul in the New Testament. Wow! What an amazing letter writer! He wrote to specific congregations or specific people to answer their questions or to address problems he was aware of, and he wrote to stay in touch with them and to encourage and support them. His writings were also very personal. He wrote of his activities, where he'd been or was going, his successes and disappointments, his hopes, his needs, and always asking for prayer. He did not hold back! When I read his letters, I hear a man who loved Christ above all else, who cared about and loved fellow Christians, and seemed to feel an urgency in spreading the message of "Jesus Christ and Him crucified" (1 Cor. 2:2). Holy Scripture at that time was basically our Old Testament, but Paul's letters were now about the promised Christ who had indeed come and completed His acts of redemption, and they gave instruction on living in response to that Good News. Many were kept and read over and again in church services and other gatherings, and shared and passed down through the years. His letters to the churches in Galatia and to the Thessalonians became the oldest of our New Testament books - our first Christian scriptures! They predate the Gospels! So, what does any of this matter, and why meditate on it? Well, I find it very interesting - and even more! These letters, found in my Bible, were fervently written by someone inspired by God, cherished and passed down through the ages by God's Hand - all from God, for me. They were written to people like me with problems and questions, and they are important to my life as a Christian! As I read them, I hear the Heavenly Father's very Word spoken by my Savior's Holy Spirit, guiding, encouraging and supporting me through this life even as He prepares me for my Heavenly life. Paul's writings are not always easy for me to understand as he often seems to race from one thought to another, but they are obviously heartfelt and genuine. They touch my heart and become even more meaningful each time I read them. Paul began his letters with, "Grace and peace to you," and that is exactly what I know - what I am blessed with when I spend time reading the Biblical letters - God's Grace and Peace. And I will close this meditation with these beautiful words from St. Paul in his letter "To the church of God in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus and called to be holy, together with all those everywhere who call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ - their Lord and ours" (1 Cor. 1:2); "The grace of the Lord Jesus be with you. My love to all of you in Christ Jesus. Amen" (1 Cor. 16:23, 24).

Homemade Cranberry Sauce

1 ½ cups sugar
¾ cup water
¼ cup orange juice
Pinch salt
16 oz. package fresh or frozen cranberries
2 tsp. orange zest

- In medium saucepan over high heat, bring sugar, water, orange juice and salt to boil. Stir to dissolve sugar.
- Add cranberries and return to boil.
- Lower heat and simmer for 10-12 minutes until most of the berries burst. Turn off heat.
- Mash with potato masher, or if desired, puree with immersion blender.
- Add orange zest, and other ingredients if desired: raisins, blueberries, pineapple, chopped pecans, cinnamon, nutmeg, etc.
- Let cool completely.
- Transfer to covered container to chill in refrigerator.
- Will keep in fridge for 10 days or in freezer for up to 2 months.
- Makes about 2 ½ cups.

Online Giving -- A word of thanks to all of you for your continued support of our ministry here at Christ Lutheran Church, and a special note of thanks to all of you who have chosen to give online through our website with the Vanco portal. In a time of less volunteerism due to Covid-19 and such, the online giving is less cumbersome and more streamlined for our Financial Secretary to manage. That being said, we would ask those of you giving through this online way to consider giving through your bank accounts (savings or checking) as opposed to using a credit/debit card. We are charged a 2.75% transaction fee whenever a credit/debit card is used, and while that may not seem like a lot for a \$25 offering (\$0.69 fee), for a \$500 offering (\$13.75 fee) those fees become quite significant. Again, we are grateful for any and all offerings and gifts to Christ Lutheran, but in order to be the best stewards of what God has entrusted to us we do kindly ask all of you credit debit card givers to consider using one of your bank accounts instead.
