

COMMUNION ANNOUNCEMENT

The Fruit of Jesus – Self Control

AS WE GATHER

As we gather for worship this Good Friday, we come to the cross of our dear Savior, Jesus Christ. The words of Martin Luther prepare us well to receive all Jesus dies to give us. "By a wonderful exchange, our sins are no longer ours but Christ's, and the righteousness of Christ is ours," Luther writes. "He has imparted that unto us, that He might clothe us with it, and fill us with it: and He has taken our evils upon Himself that He might deliver us from them. . . . In the same manner as He grieved and suffered in our sins . . . so also we rejoice and glory truly in His righteousness" (*Select Works*). Let us give Jesus glory for the "wonderful exchange" He has made with us at the cross!

Pastor: In the name of the Father and of the ♣ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

OPENING SENTENCES 2 Corinthians 5:21; Isaiah 53:5

Pastor: For our sake He made Him to be sin who knew no sin,

People: so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.

Pastor: He was wounded for our transgressions; **People:** He was crushed for our iniquities;

Pastor: upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace,

People: and with His stripes we are healed.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Pastor: Lord our God, You took upon Your shoulders the weight of fallen humanity,

becoming the sin offering for us so that we are made righteous in Your sight. Hear us as we bow before Your cross and lay our sins at Your feet.

In silent prayer, we bring the burdens of our sins to Jesus.

Pastor: Gracious Father,

People: have mercy upon us. We are undeserving of Your love.

Pastor: Loving Lord Jesus,

People: take our sins from us. Show us the depths of Your love, found only in

the cross.

Pastor: Renewing Holy Spirit,

People: Guide us and lead us. Enable us by faith to cling to the grace that

alone can save. Amen.

Pastor: Almighty God in His great mercy has given His Son to die for you and, for

His sake, He forgives you all your sins. Jesus bore our sins in His body on the cross so that we may die to sin and live in His righteousness. By His wounds, you have been healed. As a called and ordained servant of our crucified Savior, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of

the

■ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

INTROIT *Psalm 38:1–4, 18, 22; antiphon: Isaiah 53:5*

Pastor: O LORD, rebuke me not in Your anger,

People: nor discipline me in Your wrath!

Pastor: For Your arrows have sunk into me,

Pastor: For my iniquities have gone over my head;

People: like a heavy burden, they are too heavy for me.

RESPONSIVE READING Isaiah 52:13-15, 53:6-8

(God's Suffering Servant is described.)

Pastor: Behold, My servant shall act wisely;

People: He shall be high and lifted up, and shall be exalted.

Pastor: As many were astonished at you -

People: His appearance was so marred, beyond human semblance, and His

form beyond that of the children of mankind -

Pastor: so shall He sprinkle many nations;

People: kings shall shut their mouths because of Him;

Pastor: for that which has not been told them they see,

People: and that which they have not head they understand.

Pastor: We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own

way;

People: and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

Pastor: He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth;

People: he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its

shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

Pastor: By oppression and judgment he was taken away. Yet who of his generation

protested?

People: For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of

my people he was punished.

(The title over the cross)

HYMN "Stricken, Smitten, and Afflicted" LSB #451

(v. 1-3)

The fifth candle is extinguished.

PASSION READING John 19:23-24 Lector

(Soldiers divide Jesus' clothes)

The sixth candle is extinguished.

RESPONSIVE PSALM *Psalm 31:1-2, 4-5, 9-10*

Pastor: In you, LORD, I have taken refuge; let me never be put to shame;

People: deliver me in your righteousness.

Pastor: Turn your ear to me, come quickly to my rescue;

People: be my rock of refuge, a strong fortress to save me.

Pastor: Keep me free from the trap that is set for me,

People: for you are my refuge.

Pastor: Into your hands I commit my spirit; **People:** deliver me, Lord, my faithful God.

Pastor: Be merciful to me, LORD, for I am in distress;

People: my eyes grow weak with sorrow, my soul and body with grief.

Pastor: My life is consumed by anguish and my years by groaning;

People: my strength fails because of my affliction, and my bones grow weak.


