Dear Friends,

As Lutherans, we talk a lot about the theology of the cross, and how Jesus atoned for our sins through his suffering and death on the cross. The substitutionary sacrifice of Jesus on the cross stands at the center of our theology and our faith. We are a Good Friday people.

But we are also an Easter people, for without the resurrection of Jesus there is no victory over death and the grave, which means there is no eternal life and salvation. The empty tomb is as vital to our theology and faith as is the blood stained cross, and that's why the angel rolled away the stone from Jesus' tomb. That stone was not moved to let Jesus out, but to let the women in, and the disciples in, and anyone who chose to look in also, so that everyone might see that Jesus was no longer there, but that he had risen, just as he said.

As we prepare to celebrate the events of Holy Week, and as we worship each and every Sunday, may we always see the importance and the necessity of both the cross and the empty tomb. We cannot have one without the other. The death and resurrection of Jesus must always be proclaimed together, for only together do they make up the whole of our salvation—forgiveness and everlasting life. To God be the glory.

## “I will meditate”

**“I will meditate on Your wonderful works. Great is the Lord and most worthy of praise!”  
Psalm 145:5, 3**

Please, first take a moment to read Psalm 8. It’s only nine verses. . . . . My sister told me her bluebirds arrived and are beginning to nest. They show little fear and seem to enjoy her company as she watches them catch bugs to eat and bathe in a birdbath. Soon she will watch with joy as they teach their little ones to catch their own tasty bugs and show them the delights of splashing about in the birdbath. Throughout a long history, bluebirds have come to symbolize many things to many cultures. Most notably, joy that a cold dark winter is past, and hope for spring and a productive garden. An important word to me in my walk of faith, is “HOPE.” Specifically, my HOPE in Christ - not just an expectation, but a reality; not a wish, but a confidence. I read about Psalm 8, written by David, in one of my favorite books, “Reading the Psalms with Luther.” The devotion’s prayer ended with, “after the sufferings of this life, grant us to celebrate a happy Easter.” And Luther wrote, “Psalm 8 is a prophecy of Christ – His sufferings, resurrection, and kingly rule over all creatures.” Well, I didn’t get that, not in this short prayerful hymn of praise. So, as I usually do, I read it out loud, several times. My Bible’s Preface to Psalms reveals Luther read the Psalms VERY personally, and reading them out loud, helps make them personal for me. I realized Who I was speaking to as I said, “O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth. You have set your glory above the heavens” (vs 1). And, I know I’m merely a poor, miserable sinner. In a Psalm 8 commentary I read online, the author wrote this about God’s presence in the Psalms: “He is ready to crush you. His justice demands it. His power enables Him to do it . . . – but for Christ!” Yes, Christ is my only HOPE. I can say with David, “What am I that you care for me?” (vs 4), and know by faith I belong to God. I am in awe of the writers of the Psalms. They didn’t know Jesus the Christ yet spoke so confidently of God’s righteousness and promised salvation, His power and might, and His steadfast love, and they sang His praises. They knew that in their special relationship to God, they could pour out their hearts to Him, their joys, their fears, their highs and lows, their hopes and doubts – their longings and “Why’s?,” and God would hear them and care for them. They display such trust in God as their refuge and strength. Whatever happened in their lives was fully in God’s control and according to His will, and they trusted Him. I am a person of Easter. In God’s Word, I’ve seen Jesus the Savior, a baby born of a woman, a man scorned and betrayed, pouring out His heart in prayer to His Heavenly Father, brutally beaten, nailed to a cross and forsaken by God - Who then raised Him from the dead! But for sin, how can I not trust Him? Christ is my reality, my confidence, my HOPE! I see God’s power and authority over all creation everywhere I look – His majesty and glory are there. Even the sweet little bluebirds going about their lives cannot escape His gaze and care (Mt. 10:29, Lk.12:24). Such is His LOVE. Yes, I’m starting to get it. The Psalms point to Jesus! When I read them at a personal level, Christ has to be in the Psalms. He is my only HOPE! Yes, Psalm 8 is a prophecy of the Savior, a promise of His Kingdom come, of our Easter and HOPE fulfilled! And so, I can pray my devotional book’s prayer for Psalm 8: “Lord Jesus, You were delivered for our offenses, and raised again for our justification. Endue Your Word with power, strengthen our faith, and after the sufferings of this life grant us to celebrate a *HAPPY EASTER*, rising again to live and reign with You in all eternity. Amen.” *Duannah*

### CORN CASSEROLE

A great side dish for your Easter meal, especially with ham.

8 oz box Jiffy Corn Muffin mix

15 oz can whole kernel corn, drained

15 oz can cream-style corn

1 cup sour cream

4 Tbsp butter, melted

1 egg, beaten

Preheat oven to 350°. Stir together all ingredients and pour into a greased baking dish (9X11). Bake uncovered 45 to 50 minutes. Serve warm.
