Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

One of my favorite statements in the Bible is a statement made by Paul in Romans 4 concerning Abraham. Paul wrote in verse 18: "Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations, just as it had been said to him." Paul went on to write of Abraham: <sup>19</sup> "Without weakening in his faith, he faced the fact that his body was as good as dead—since he was about a hundred years old—and that Sarah's womb was also dead. <sup>20</sup> Yet he did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God, <sup>21</sup> being fully persuaded that God had power to do what he had promised."

Abraham had no good earthly reason to believe that he and Sarah could still have a child, and yet he believed it would happen anyway simply because God said so. And thus while there was no practical reason to still hope that he and Sarah would become parents, he hoped anyway. Against all hope he continued to hope.

That is the nature of faith. It is to see as completed action that which has not even begun to take place because God has promised it. As I wrote in my song Faith, recorded by Fred Frieling "Faith sees with eyes the things that can't be seen. It knows as truth what yet has never been. It trusts as day when all it sees is night, and hopes in God to make what's wrong be right."

May we, like Abraham, have such faith to hope in God even when all our earthly reasons for hoping are gone. For nothing is impossible with God — the cross and the empty grave are proof of that. To God be the glory.

# Letter from the President



The month of March represents the continuation of Lent and our time of renewal and reflection. This will culminate with Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services and lead up to a joyous Easter celebration on March 31st of the resurrection of Jesus and our eternal victory. I encourage you to attend whenever possible. A soup lunch is available following each of the Wednesday Lenten services and Maundy Thursday.

At its February meeting, the Church Council voted to direct Lenten offerings for our midweek services to Water to Thrive (www.watertothrive.org). As a congregation, we will use this as a starting point for a \$5,000 sponsorship of a well. Once the well is completed, we will be told where the well is located in Africa, how many people are served and will be able to have our name put on a plaque at the well. We have a goal of raising the required amount over the next six months. Please consider a donation toward this wonderful, life-sustaining project.

The Council began discussions on the future of the Pumpkin Patch. The patch has been a wonderful opportunity to serve the community and support the growers and Water to Thrive. That said, securing sufficient volunteers from the congregation has become increasingly difficult. We as a congregation will need to weigh the pros and cons of committing resources to continue this specific ministry.

For the next voters' assembly, the Council will propose an amendment to our constitution that will remove the male-only restriction on the president and vicepresident officer positions. Council also directed Jordan to begin a refresh of the congregation's website. We hope to incorporate some of the excellent content of the old site into the new one while improving visual appeal and furthering our goal of discipling the lost. Finally, the Council approved the addition of Stephen Becker to the Board of Trustees.

Lastly, I was blessed to participate in two recent volunteer opportunities including the Central Texas Food Bank and Down Home Ranch. I encourage each of you to watch the calendar and bulletin for continuing opportunities to live out our mission of providing loving service.

Online Giving -- A word of thanks to all of you for your continued support of our ministry here at Christ Lutheran Church, and a special note of thanks to all of you who have chosen to give online through our website with the Vanco portal. In a time of less volunteerism due to Covid-19 and such, the online giving is less cumbersome and more streamlined for our Financial Secretary to manage. That being said, we would ask those of you giving through this online way to consider giving through your bank accounts (savings or checking) as opposed to using a credit/debit card. We are charged a 2.75% transaction fee whenever a credit/debit card is used, and while that may not seem like a lot for a \$25 offering (\$0.69 fee), for a \$500 offering (\$13.75 fee) those fees become quite significant. Again, we are grateful for any and all offerings and gifts to Christ Lutheran, but in order to be the best stewards of what God has entrusted to us we do kindly ask all of you credit debit card givers to consider using one of your bank accounts instead. Thank you.
