"I will meditate"

"I will meditate on Your wonderful works. Great is the Lord and most worthy of praise!" *Psalm 145:5, 3*

"The Procession of My God, My King!"

After church one Sunday, we drove through the neighborhood, one my sister, brother, and I had grown up in. As we went past Fulmore Junior High School (since renamed Lively Middle School), we reminisced about our happy days there as band members, especially when our band took part in the Band Day Parade up Congress Avenue. In the 1960's, Austin invited marching bands from all over Texas to participate in this event. It was so much fun! Colorful uniforms, sounds of instruments tuning, kids and band directors hollering to be heard, whistles, laughter, and idling diesel school buses – it all created a loud and joyous atmosphere south of the river where the bands mustered – and there were many bands! Oh, we marched with knees lifted high and instruments loudly played in celebration of marching bands. With military-style precision, we marched across the Colorado River bridge and up the 10 crowded blocks to the Capitol Complex, playing well-rehearsed Sousa marches over and over. Then, with legs now too tired to lift knees, we went around the corner and another two blocks to the Governor's Mansion where we were dismissed to go hunt for parents. No worries, it was ALL FUN! O! I do love a parade! Each Thanksgiving Day, I get up early to watch at least some of the Macy's Thanksgiving Parade on television. And, I do try to catch a glimpse of Santa on his parade float! I think King David also enjoyed a good parade. Read his description of a parade in Psalm 68:24-27: "Your procession has come into view, O God, the procession of my God and King into the sanctuary. In front are the singers, after them the musicians; with them are the maidens playing tambourines. Praise God in the great congregation, praise the Lord in the assembly of Israel! There is the little tribe of Benjamin, leading them, there the great throng of Judah's princes, and here the princes of Zebulun and of Naphtali." David writes as if he's watching it go by! He's absolutely filled with joyful excitement! Martin Luther wrote about Psalm 68, it "is a beautiful and powerful prophesy of Christ"; that "David sings his song of joy over the holy kingdom of grace and life," and "is so completely and joyfully stirred in spirit" (*Reading the Psalms with Luther*). Psalm 68 is a bit hard for me to understand, but my study Bible says it "seems to be an 'order of service' for a procession at the Jerusalem temple." So, the Israelites annual pilgrimages to the temple to worship, included a parade! The Psalm speaks of Israel's salvation as the Lord led them out of Egypt, provided for them as they wandered in the wilderness, and brought them to the Promised Land. We read of God's greatness, His strength and power; of a Lord who came among us, the Savior of all who believe, who ascended and gave us the gifts of His Holy Spirit. Then David says: "Praise be to the Lord, to God our Savior, who daily bears our burden. Our God is a God who saves; from the Sovereign Lord comes escape from death!" (vs 19-20). You can hear David's true joy! Reading Psalm 68 into the present, into my life, I know with David that our Savior is all-sufficient, all that I need! Jesus, King David's Savior, is my Savior, the same vesterday, today and forever! He bore the burden of my sin to the cross and is the source of my forgiveness. He is active in my life - EVERY moment of EVERY day in EVERY way! And, He is my Hope of Heaven! With great joy, David wrote of a parade he had witnessed, a parade of the only true and almighty God and King! A parade in celebration of God - His great Love, and our salvation! David wrote, "You are awesome, O God, in your sanctuary. Praise be to God! (vs 35). I pray we may always turn to our Lord in His precious Word and Sacraments with the exuberant joy of David, and worship and praise Him only, our God and our Savior! With Great JOY! Duannah

<u>Cinnamon Honey Butter</u> Spread on rolls, toast, or muffins – this sweet butter is amazingly good! Also delicious on pumpkin bread, banana bread, pancakes, and waffles!

1/2 cup (1 stick) unsalted butter, softened
3 Tbsp. honey
1/3 cup powdered sugar
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/8 tsp. vanilla

Beat butter until creamy. Beat in honey. Add powdered sugar, cinnamon & vanilla. Mix until blended. Keep tightly covered in fridge for up to 1 month.
